Sacramental Preparation



Catholic schools in the Archdiocese follow the 'Come & See' syllabus of Religious Education. Children in every year group will follow the same three themes each term but individual classes will have their own topic—these will help enhance the knowledge and understanding of their religion and allow them to celebrate it.

'Come & See'

The focus of this term's work in Religious Education will be: **Local Church—Community, Eucharist—Relating** and **Lent/Easter—Giving**. Each class will be exploring these themes through their own topics (*see opposite*).

The different celebrations which occur throughout the year are important to us as a Christian family and we encourage you to celebrate with us in a number of ways: Class Assemblies, Masses, Sacraments etc.

Class Assemblies

Throughout the year, each class celebrates with a religious class assembly or service to which ALL parents and carers, grandparents and friends are invited. This term, we have the following celebrations to look forward to.

(7th March—End of Term)

HOME ACTIVITIES: As a family talk about how you are going to practice self-control and self-giving for the rest of the season of Lent. You may decide to give up biscuits or cakes and donate the money to a charity. If you have an older child provide him/her with an opportunity to take part in The Stations of the Cross. Ask your child/ren how the school is focusing on Lent and self-giving.
