

#### What 'remote learning' can I expect from St. Brigid's Catholic Primary School?

This information is to be used as a general guide and parents/ carers can expect further details of remote learning for their child as and when it is required. We aim to implement remote learning from your child's second day of absence. There are 3 general scenarios outlined below:

- **TIER 1**                      Single Isolation (individual child / family)
- **TIER 2**                      Class / Bubble Lockdown
- **TIER 3**                      Whole School Lockdown

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>TIER 2</b></p> <p>My child's whole class/bubble is not permitted to attend school because they, or another member of their bubble, have tested positive for Covid-19</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Teachers will contact children daily via Seesaw/EExAT and once per week via a call home</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ <b>Maths lessons</b> – Children will be directed to <a href="https://classroom.thenational.academy/schedule-by-year">https://classroom.thenational.academy/schedule-by-year</a> to complete online lessons linked to the weekly objectives covered for that week.</li> <li>➤ <b>English lessons</b> – Children will be directed to <a href="https://classroom.thenational.academy/schedule-by-year">https://classroom.thenational.academy/schedule-by-year</a> and a unit relating to the class topic will be suggested for your child.</li> <li>➤ <b>Phonics/ Support for spelling</b> – Children will have access to weekly spelling set by the class teacher. Children will be encouraged to investigate the sounds highlighted using: YouTube / DFE Letters and Sounds for Reception, Y1 &amp; Y2 Spelling Shed – weekly spellings for Y1 to Y6</li> <li>➤ <b>Topic task(s)</b> - Suggested 'topic' learning will be made and linked to the current learning in the classroom. <i>If in school when the bubble is closed, children will take home a resource pack with paper based learning activities and links to additional e-learning resources</i> <b>Work produced during these sessions should be uploaded to Seesaw and shared with the class teacher</b></li> </ul>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>TIER 3</b></p> <p>We enter another 'lockdown' with total school closure.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ As TIER 2 + additional paper-based resources provided (including CGL booklets)</li> <li>➤ <b>1:1 support</b> – If your child receives 1:1 support from a person other than their teacher/TA, a bespoke programme of support will be set up. This may include phone calls / video chats with your child's 1:1 support. They will also be expected to complete the learning set on the school website linked to their year group or alternative work as directed by their class teacher</li> </ul>
