

I am looking around to see where we will go and will let you know next week and the cost of the day.



Parish Mass Times

Over the past few months I have been reflecting on the times of Masses, our numbers and if there are any tweaks or changes we could make. I have come up with the following suggestions.



Weekedays: At present our Mass is at 9.15am Tuesday to

Saturday, and the biggest congregation we have had is 8. I wonder if the timing is too early, so I am proposing to move it to 10.00am with Exposition moving to 9.00am.

Sundays: People asked if we could have a Saturday evening Mass. I am reluctant to put one on, as there are many in the Deanery and there are times I am asked to cover Saturday Masses, when a priest is away, as some have covered our 5.00pm Mass.

Mass at 10.00am seems to be popular time so I am proposing we keep this Mass at this time.

The 5.00pm Mass is poorly attended and there have been times we have not even reached double figures in the congregation. I am proposing, that we drop the Sunday evening Mass, and go down to one Mass on a Sunday.

One benefit of having just one Sunday Mass is that the whole of the parish community come together as one family around the table of the Lord, and we get to know each other, not just the community of the Mass we attend.

I have used the word proposed a number of times and that is what this is a proposal for changes in our Mass times. Nothing is set in stone, and nothing will change until you have had your say. Please come and talk to me, and let me know what you think of the changes proposed. Your view is important to me and I want to hear what you think. Please do let me know and I promise every view will be taken into consideration, if we make any changes to our Mass times.

Catholic Social Action

This month I have been working with colleagues on the Archdiocese environmental policy and strategy. This is in a response to Pope Francis's 2015 encyclical Laudato Si'; to care for and protect our common home. It follows the call by Archbishop Malcolm to respond to the Ecological Crisis and the practical guidance issued to all Diocesan Departments by the Catholic Bishops Conference of England and Wales in 2019.
