


Between February and July, back in 1858, Our Blessed Lady made 14 appearances to the young Bernadette Soubirous. During the apparitions Mary told Bernadette that she was the Immaculate Conception, a dogma only promulgated 4 years earlier in 1854, and to tell the parish priest, Abbé Dominique Peyramale, to build a chapel and to bring the people in procession, which he did, and in 1923 the Archdiocese of Liverpool made its first pilgrimage to Lourdes. Therefore, this years pilgrimage is special, as it is the centenary of that first pilgrimage to Lourdes and also the centenary of the miracle healing of Jack Traynor. Please keep all the pilgrims in your prayers, for a safe journey to and from Lourdes.

## Lonola Certificate in Vastoral Illinistry

We are now accepting applications for the Certificate in Pastoral Ministry run by Loyola University, Chicago. It is for anyone interested in beginning to support their church, as well as those who already are. Whether you're a Parish Secretary, a School Chaplain, a Catechist, a general helper or involved in any other form of Pastoral Ministry, this course could be for you. There are 10 modules and topics include:



- Scripture
- Catechesis
- Leadership

The course runs for 2 years (September 2023 – July 2025) and requires a commitment of approximately 3-4 hours a week. The teaching format is flexible and is perfect for those with busy lives as well as for people with a little time on their hands.
