This event forms part of our Music at the Met 2024 concert programme.

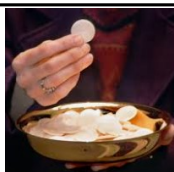

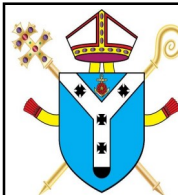
Readers Rota

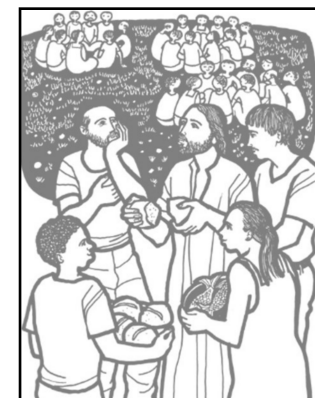

New Dawn Pilgrimage -

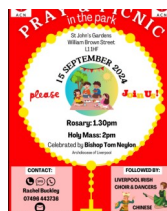

New Lectionary

The Bishops Conference of England and Wales, has agreed that from the beginning of Advent 2024, the Church in England and Wales will begin using a new translation of the Scriptures at Mass and other liturgies. The Lectionary, which is the book that contains the Scripture readings for Mass and the Sacraments, is changing as part of the continuing process of revising liturgical translations. The process began with the Roman Missal in 2011 and has continued with all the other liturgical texts. The new Lectionary will use the English Standard Version - Catholic Edition of the Bible and the Abbey Psalter. The changes are intended to make the biblical translations more faithful to the original languages, biblical scholarship, and to provide a text for use in liturgical setting that is more proclaimable and, where appropriate, more inclusive. If you use the Universalis app (which I use on my phone) the new translations are available on there, go to December 1st and you can explore the new translation of the Scriptures.
